We the People of the United States,

In order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, ensure Domestic Tranquility, provide for the Common Defense, promote the General Welfare, and secure the Blessing of Liberty and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

--Preamble to the United States Constitution

The purpose of the Republic is to accomplish the following:

- Re-establish and maintain the Constitutional government and de jure institutions of lawful government abandoned in the 1860s
- Restore the inherent and unalienable rights bestowed on We the People by the original Republic for the United States of America Constitution.
- End unlawful taxation and prosecutions for resisting the transfer of private wealth to organizations such as the IRS (a registered corporation in Puerto Rico that operates in over 200 countries).
- End all prosecutions that lack an injured party

The United States exists in two forms:

The original United States of America that was in operation until 1860, was a collection of sovereign Republics within the Union of States. Under the original Constitution, the States controlled the Federal Government. The Federal Government did not control the States and had very little authority.

The original United States has been usurped by a separate and different UNITED STATES formed in 1871, that 'legally' only controls the District of Columbia and its territories, and which is actually a corporation (United States Corporation) that acts as our current government.

The United States Corporation operates under Corporate/Commercial Law, rather than Common Law. The original Constitution was never removed; it has simply been dormant since 1871. It is still intact to this day. This fact was made clear by Supreme Court Justice Marshall Harlan (Downes v. Bidwell, 182, U.S. 244 1901) by giving the following dissenting opinion: "...two national governments exist; one to be maintained under the Constitution, with all its restrictions; the other to be maintained by Congress outside and independent of that instrument."
